1. All flowers will be received Thursday, Sept. 20, 2012 from 8:30 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. Judging starts at 12 noon by accredited judges using the Danish System.
2. Containers for horticulture furnished by Fair
3. Each exhibitor may make one entry in each arrangement class. Unlimited entries permitted in horticulture provided varieties are not duplicated.
4. All horticulture must be grown by the exhibitor, but flowers in the arrangements section need not be.
5. Mats, figurines, candles and other accessories permitted.
6. Novice arrangement open to anyone who has not yet won over three blue ribbons in arrangements.
7. Ribbons will be awarded for best exhibits.
8. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to identify flowers by class and lot before entering.
9. No artificial flowers, fruits or foliage will be accepted
10. Professional arrangements will be judged in a separate category. Please specify when entering; professional (works at a job related to flowers, arrangements or a florist) novice (anyone who has not received 3 blue ribbons, or first time arranging), or amateur (one who has entered flowers and won more than 3 blue ribbons in arranging).

Note: The exhibitor needs to groom entries before entering. Grooming is discarding dead leaves or blooms past their prime. Clean dust off leaves and have clean containers or flower pots.

Point Value: Blue 6, Red 4, White 2

Class A - Asters

(1 bloom on each stem -3 stems of 1 variety)

1. Single (1 color, 1 bloom on 1 stem) 3 stems
2. Pompon ball (1 color, 1 bloom on 1 stem) 3 stems
3. Powderpuff Princess (1 color, 1 bloom on 1 stem) 3 stems
4. Oregon or Fluffy (1 color, 1 bloom on 1 stem) 3 stems
5. Cactus (1 color, 1 bloom on 1 stem) 3 stems
6. Other (1 color, 1 bloom on 1 stem) 3 stems

Class B - Succulents and Cactus

1. Any Variety

Class C - Celosia

1. Plume type (3 blooms, 1 color)
2. Crested (1 large bloom)
3. Amaranth (1 large bloom)
4. Other

Class D - Chrysanthemums

(1 spray - defined as a branching portion cut back to main stalk.)

1. Single or daisy Anemone
2. Cushion or Azaleamum
3. Decorative
4. Decorative (disbuds 1 bloom)
5. Spider, Spoon or Quill
6. Pompon or Button
7. Other

Class E - Cosmos

1. (1 spray, any color)

Class F- Dahlia

(should be shown with one pair of leaves)

1. Large, Decorative (1 bloom)
2. Small, Decorative (1 bloom)
3. Cactus or Semi-Cactus (1 bloom)
4. Ball, Mini Ball, or Pompon (1 bloom)
5. Waterlily (1 bloom)
6. Orchid (1 bloom)
7. Fimbriated (1 bloom)
8. Novelty and Other (1 bloom)

Class G - Daisies

1. Esther Reed (3 blooms)
2. Shasta, single (3 blooms)
3. Crested or semi - double (3 blooms)
4. Gloriosa (3 blooms)
5. Painted Daisy (3 blooms)
6. Michaelmas (1 spray)
7. Other

Class H - Everlasting

1. Helichrysum (straw flower) (6 stems)
2. Statice (3 sprays, 1 color)
3. Others (6 stems)

Class I - Geraniums

1. 1 stem (any color, large flower head)

Class J - Gladiolas

(1 spike for all)

(Best shown with 1/3 buds closed, 1\3 buds partially open, 1\3 fully open)

1. Large size flowers
2. Medium size flowers
3. Small size flowers
4. Miniaturize flowers

Class K - Marigolds

1. Giant (over 3", yellow or orange)
2. Dwarf (single) 3 Blooms
3. Dwarf (double) 3 Blooms
4. Any other variety (3 blooms, 1 color)

Class L - Pansies

1. Any color (6 stems)

Class M - Petunias

1. Grandiflora (single - giant 3 1/2" or over)
2. Grandiflora (double giant - 3 1/2" or over)
3. Multiflora (bedding cascade to 3 1/2")
4. California Giant (veined, 3 1/2" or over)

Class N - Roses

1. Peace
2. Floribunda (1 spray)
3. Grandiflora
4. Hybrid Tea (must be disbudded)
5. Climbing
6. Miniature
7. Other or Hedge

Class O - Snapdragons

1. 3 spikes, 1 or more color

Class P - Sweet Peas

1. 3 stems any color

Class Q - Sunflower

1. Branching (3 blooms)
2. Teddy Bear (3 blooms)

Class R - Zinnias

(3 blooms on 3 stems, 1 color)

1. Dahlia flowered
2. Cactus flowered
3. Crested flowered
4. Dwarf, Liliput or Pompon
5. Other varieties

Class S - Houseplants

(one crown or plant to a container)

1. Flowering
2. Foliage
3. African Violets
4. Cactus

Class T - Terrarium or Dish Garden

(Make sure they're groomed)

1. All types

Class U—Collection

1. Six stems of same variety not classified above
2. Six stems of any variety

Class V - Hanging Basket

(Make sure they are groomed)

1. One of any variety

Class W - Berried Shrub

1. One spray of any variety

Class X - Patio or Container Plants

1. One of any variety
2. Various plants in container

ARRANGEMENTS
(All Natural Materials)***

Point Value: Blue 10 - Red 7 - White 3

1. GOING COURTIN'

A bouquet arrangement using fresh flowers for courtin'.

2. BLUE JEANS

A fresh arrangement using various shades of blue flowers.

3. HAT & BOOTS

A dried arrangement in either a cowboy hat or cowboy boot incorporating grains and grasses.

4. MEMORY LANE

A fall arrangement using fresh flowers.

5. COUNTRY DREAMS

Designer's choice.

6. HOME FOR CHRISTMAS

A fresh arrangement incorporating pine boughs.

***DIVISION 3
YOUTH***

Point Values: Same as adults

Open to all youths 18 years and under.

Use same horticulture and arrangement class as adults.
