

LIVESTOCK

1. Animals must be owned by the exhibitor.
2. The Fair Association will not be responsible for any loss or damage.
3. The same animal cannot be exhibited in the Junior and Open Classes. No more than two entries in any lot.
4. No award will be made in any class or lot unless the entries are deemed worthy by the judges.
5. Judging time will be posted in livestock area.
6. Livestock must be properly secured. Neck ropes and halters mandatory with all large animals.
7. All stalls must be cleaned by 9 a.m.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

- (a) Washington livestock requires no vaccinations or tests for entry
- (b) Individual health certificates are not required for entry.
- (c) Fair veterinarians will inspect all classes of livestock and poultry before they are exhibited to determine that the livestock and poultry are free from infectious or contagious disease and ectoparasites. All poultry must be US pullorum-typhoid clean or equivalent or tested negative for pullorum-typhoid within ninety (90) days of the exhibit.
- (d) Fair veterinarians **MUST AND WILL** reject any animal with infectious or contagious disease or ectoparasites. Exhibitors should be aware that Ringworm, Warts, Pinkeye, Strangles, Contagious Ecthyma, Scabies, Lice, Mites, Ticks and Fleas fall into these categories.
- (e) No animal from any quarantined area or premise will be permitted to enter any fair.
- (f) All out-of-state entries must comply with the State of Washington Import Regulations. A health certificate will be issued by an accredited Veterinarian from the state of origin for all out-of-state livestock and poultry entries.

FITTING AND SHOWING

Rules and Eligibility

1. There shall be five trophies given in this contest: Dairy, Beef, Swine, Sheep and Goats.
2. All junior exhibitors are automatically entered in this contest and any who wish may participate.
3. All training and preparation of animals both prior to and during the show, to be done by the contestants.
4. At the conclusion of the Fitting and Showing Judging Contest a Round Robin Exhibition will be held for educational purposes.
5. Scoring will be on a point basis.
6. All contestants scoring 75 points or more will receive Blue Ribbons. Contestants scoring from 50 to 74 points will receive Red Ribbons. Those scoring less than 50 points will receive White Ribbons.
7. Premium points will be awarded as follows Blue 40; Red 30; White 20.
8. Champion ribbons will be awarded in each division. Merchandise or other awards may be given at the discretion of the Fair Board.
9. Time of judging to be posted in the Livestock area.

Basis of Awards

- I. Preparation for showing 40 points
- A. Condition of feet
 - B. Fleshing and condition of animal
 - C. Cleanliness and grooming
1. Cattle and hogs:
 - a. Condition of coat. Freedom of scruff or dirt, score down for excess of oil talc or objectionable materials.
 - b. Trimming of head, tail, ears, etc.
 - c. Training and condition of horns.
 2. Sheep
 - a. Fleece free from briars, chaff, dung, locks etc.

b. Preparation of fleece in accordance to breed standards.

II. Showing of animal	60 points
A. Appearance of exhibitor	
B. Control of animal by exhibitor	
C. Poise and coolness of exhibitor	
D. Skills in showing including:	
1. Continuous attention	
2. Keeping the animal placed to advantage	
3. Ability to stand or move animal as requested by the Judge

1. Youth
2. Adult
1. Champion Ribbon for Youth and Adult
2. In the Youth Division fleeces must be from Ewes owned by the club member and carried in his 4-H or FFA project.
3. Fleeces must have been shorn this year and not represent more than one years growth excepting yearling fleeces
4. Each exhibitor may enter only two fleeces.
5. Fleeces entered shall have been selected by exhibitor.
6. Each fleece should be marked Wool Show.
7. Classification will be based on breeds.
8. These will be entered in the main fair building.

Point Value: Blue 20, Red 15, White 10
